All the directors are volunteers, who give freely of their expertise and time; there is no claim for their services provided, either by reimbursement, or the provision of an allowance, or by direct payment to a third party.

During the year, both Co-founders celebrated 10 consecutive years as Board members. Given their active participation, and the skills and expertise that they bring to support the mission, values and performance of FBSG, it was a logical and unanimous decision to extend their term of office.

Conflict of Interest Policy

Board members and employees are required to perform their duties at all times in the best interest of FBSG. They are required to

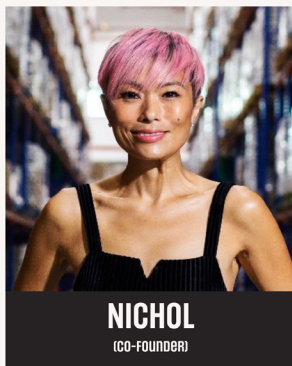
read and understand the conflict of interest policies in place and make full disclosure of any interests, relationships, and holdings that could potentially result in a conflict of interest.

Board members are required to complete a Conflict of Interest Disclosure Statement at the start of the term, annually or as soon as such conflict or the possibility of such conflict arises.

Employees are required to complete a Conflict of Interest Statement at the point of hire.

When a conflict of interest situation arises, the Board member or employee must abstain from participating in the discussion, decision-making and voting on the matter.

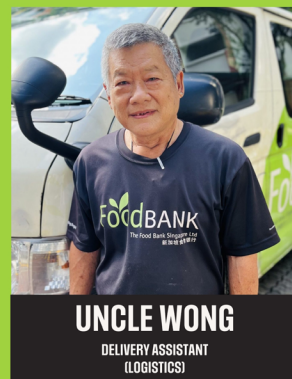

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

ANNOUNCEMENT OF YUNG RAJA, OUR PHYGITAL AMBASSADOR

To promote **FBSG's metaverse debut**, we engaged **Yung Raja** to be our **Phygital Ambassador** to end food insecurity in Singapore. Yung Raja is a renowned rapper and songwriter in the local scene, and has been releasing music that resonates with the Singaporean audience.



METVERSE LAUNCH

On **21 April 2022**, FBSG ventured into the realm of the metaverse by adopting a phygital (a combination of physical and digital) approach. The debut in the metaverse commenced with the auction of non-fungible tokens (NFTs) to raise funds to support 10,000 beneficiaries in Singapore with food and essential items for an entire year.

The honorary art NFTs feature FBSG's mascot, **KooriMo**, and include a unique utility to benefit and honour the successful bidder. The three sets are drawn by an artist from Smobler Studios, FBSG's metaverse partner.

About Smobler Studios: Smobler Studios is a leading metaverse architect that owns the biggest metaverse, Cobbleland in Sandbox. Through the partnership, FBSG and Smobler Studios hopes to build KooriLand with assets that can be sold in the metaverse, raising funds to support the food bank's mission of ending food insecurity in Singapore.

"We are piloting this move into the metaverse as a new way of fundraising. It's an exciting new world that lets us experiment with different concepts and reach out beyond Singapore to a global audience. NFT is a cool and interesting way to use art to spread our messages. From our metaverse experiment, we hope to share lessons learnt with fellow non-government organisations so that they too can consider this space for their fundraising efforts. We also warmly welcome government agencies to work alongside us to make the metaverse a safe and secured mode of donation,"

LAUNCH OF HUNGER REPORT 2 - LIVE PANEL DISCUSSION

First introduced in 2020, *the Hunger Report Part I* revealed findings that one out of 10 individuals in Singapore experience food insecurity. On **25 March 2022**, in collaboration with Lien Centre for Social Innovation and Tolaram, FBSG launched ***the Hunger Report Part II***, which focused on addressing specific needs arising from the COVID-19 pandemic.

*“When we embarked on the Hunger Report Part I in 2018, the world was vastly different from what it is now. After publishing the first Hunger Report in 2020, we observed that **10.4%** of the population faced some form of food insecurity, which was concerning. In light of the pandemic’s global impact, we decided in 2020 to closely monitor and study how attitudes and needs have changed during this crisis through *The Hunger Report Part II*.”*

The Hunger Report Part II was launched during FBSG’s Panel Discussion, Diversity in Hunger – Freedom of Choice. It was a hybrid session that took place at our headquarters and was also live-streamed on our LinkedIn page and Facebook Live.

Nichol Ng was the moderator for the panel, which included distinguished panelists and industry experts. Together, they engaged in a lively discussion with the report’s authors, where key findings on food insecurity in Singapore were presented, alongside with interesting insights and recommendations to tackle the food insecurity issue in Singapore. Findings from *the Hunger Report Part II*:

#1 THE NEED FOR AUTONOMY & CHOICE

There is a strong need to facilitate access to suitable food while supporting individuals facing economic difficulties. The ability to make choices regarding one’s food is an empowering act that preserves the recipient’s dignity and autonomy, enabling them to make purchasing decisions that align with their family’s best interests.

#2 THE NEED FOR PERSONAL HYGIENE ITEMS

The study revealed that **18.6%** of the recipients’ money was spent on non-food items, such as toiletries and cleaning products. This highlights the gaps that still need to be addressed. The emphasis on promoting healthier lifestyles has resulted in a high demand for personal hygiene items that are inadequately supplied.



DRIVE HUNGER AWAY 3: REGIONAL EDITION



In conjunction with **World Food Day 2022**, FBSG conducted our third edition of *Drive Hunger Away*. This edition saw us partnering with **17 car clubs**, with 99 volunteers and 383 cars participating, raising **over SGD 44,000** and **7,200 kg** of food donations.

We were also delighted to see eight sister food banks across the region join us in our efforts, holding their own successful fundraising campaigns from 8 October through World Food Day on 16 October. We extend our gratitude to Feeding Hong Kong, FoodCycle Indonesia, Green Food Bank China, Rise Against Hunger Philippines, Kechara Soup Kitchen, Scholars of Sustenance Bali, Thailand, and The Philippines, and all the others for their unwavering support in the fight against food insecurity.



LAUNCH OF FEEDING DIRECTORY

On **22 November 2022**, we also launched *The Feeding Directory* (FindFoodSuport.sg) to assist those looking for food support near them, with **over 150** of FBSG's feeding partners listed in the directory.

According to *the Hunger Report Part I*, despite Singapore's long history of food aid, only **22%** of food-insecure households are currently receiving assistance. Therefore, FBSG recognises the importance of connecting those in need with available resources in order to achieve their goal of ending food insecurity in the coming years.

"To achieve our goal of ending food insecurity in the next few years, FBSG feels that it is vital to find a way to let those in need know where the aid is," said Nichol Ng, Co-founder of FBSG.

The Feeding Directory connects social workers, food insecure households and anyone in search of food support to organisations that provide food aid such as cooked meals, food vouchers, food rations, and even daily essentials from FBSG's Food Pantry vending machines.



FBSG 10TH ANNIVERSARY BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS/ MASAK MASAK

In **August 2022**, we commemorated FBSG's 10th anniversary. The celebration saw foodbankers, volunteers, supporters, and beneficiaries gathered together to commemorate this milestone. To mark our 10th anniversary, we had a cake-cutting session, with the cake sponsored by Bob the Baker.

Furthermore, two chefs, **Chef Chaik Ming Koh** (also part of our Board of Directors) and **Chef Maya Patnaik**, were also invited to share their healthy recipes as part of the Masak Masak Programme.

The programme attracted about 60 attendees, and was livestreamed on Facebook as well.

We are constantly looking for new innovative ways to empower our beneficiaries to lead healthier lives. Stemmed from the belief that eating well is key to a happy life, Masak Masak is a programme run by FBSG to increase awareness of eating healthily at home while also providing our beneficiaries the opportunity to learn new healthy recipes using the food items from FBSG's Food Bundles.



OUR PROGRAMMES



JUNIORS CLUB

FBSG recognises the importance of instilling a sense of service and social responsibility in the younger generation to uphold our commitment to sustainability. The Juniors Club programme serves as a catalyst for positive social change, building awareness among youth through a highly engaging curriculum and experiential learning opportunities. This has allowed our young participants to develop a deeper understanding of food insecurity in Singapore, enabling them to take informed steps towards ending hunger.

We held 10 sessions of Juniors Club in 2022 and saw over **190 enthusiastic members** coming together to learn about food insecurity and the need to reduce food wastage. Some older children helped us pack **300 bundles** of food, which we delivered to our feeding partners, while younger children learned about food production and turned food scraps into soap.

Through these hands-on activities, we hope the children gained a better understanding of food waste and insecurity, and left with a newfound determination to build a brighter, more food-secure Singapore.

JOY IN EVERY BUNDLE

FBSG's Bundle Campaign brings Joy In Every Bundle. Our hassle-free and easy donation process ensures that every dollar donated covers the cost of food items, packaging and logistics. As a responsible food purchaser, we work with a network of food suppliers to guarantee value for money in every bundle offered.

In the year of 2022, **over 199 donations** were made which allowed us to purchase a total of **31,695 bundles**, with **190,170kg** of food being distributed to our beneficiaries!

FOOD DRIVES

Since our founding in 2012, FBSG has remained steadfast in our commitment to addressing the issue of food insecurity on our island by bridging the gap between excess food and those in need.

One way we have been supporting our efforts is by facilitating food drives. These events not only generate additional donations to ensure a steady supply of food rations but also help raise awareness about the urgent need to tackle food insecurity and food wastage. By inspiring others to act, food drives can play a pivotal role in creating a sustainable solution to this issue.

In 2022, we conducted **161 food drives**, collecting a staggering **36,378.35 kg** of food donations from individuals and corporate groups alike. We are immensely grateful to our supporters for their unwavering dedication to our cause, and we look forward to continuing our mission of ending food insecurity in Singapore.

FOOD BANK CARD PROGRAMME / FOOD PANTRY 2.0

FBSG has implemented innovative programmes to make food assistance more accessible to those in need. One such programme is Food Pantry 2.0, which offers vending machines to dispense a variety of food options in the heartlands, ensuring that beneficiaries receive timely and diverse food aid.

Another programme developed by FBSG is The Bank Card Programme. Launched in 2019, this programme provides beneficiaries with the freedom of choice to get the type of food they need from participating F&B outlets. Details of the programme are as follows:

- Every **\$50 donation** will enable FBSG to support a beneficiary through the FBSG bank card for **15 days**.
- Every **\$25 donation** will enable FBSG to support a beneficiary through the FBSG bank card for **seven days**.

In 2022, The Bank Card Programme has provided over **3,100 bank cards** with a total redemption value of **\$574,542.77** and **50,866 transaction** counts. In addition, the vending machines have dispensed **47,076.65kg of food**, and **3,626 hot meals** have been distributed. These programmes are critical in bridging the gap between excess food and food insecurity, ensuring that beneficiaries have access to nutritious food options, and we are thankful for the kind donations.

Our volunteer driver Grace exudes so much positive energy that you are bound to be inspired.

She has been volunteering with FBSG since September 2021. As a member of the Pink Car Club, she also volunteered her time to participate in our regional #DriveHungerAway edition this year. She was impressed by how well the event was organised and loved how it felt like being a part of a fun carnival.

Besides being a volunteer with FBSG, Grace also works with an animal shelter to support their cause.

“My approach towards volunteer/charity work is like exercise. It’s not always comfortable but it’s ultimately always good for you.

I often tell people that there are so many types of exercise we can do. The important thing is to find the one that you enjoy, and then it will be easier to stick with it and make it a habit.

So likewise, for charity work, there are so many different options out there, we just need to find a cause that we can identify with, and if the organisation’s options for volunteer work matches your needs, then the fit is right, and it will be easy to continue helping regularly.”

Elsa has been helping deliver monthly food rations with her family since she was six years old. She attended FBSG’s Juniors Club session last year where she developed a deep understanding of food wastage and food insecurity.

Elsa baked and sold cookies for her school’s Girl Guides and pledged to donate a dollar for every tin of cookies she sold. When she came across FBSG’s Bank Box at the Wisteria Mall, she decided to go shopping for our beneficiaries, guided by FBSG’s monthly Warehouse Wish list.

She acted as the perfect role model for her younger brother and enrolled him to donate his pocket money as well.

Junior Foodbanker Elsa believes that by sharing her story widely, she will inspire other young leaders to drive change within their communities. She hopes educational institutes will hold regular food donation sessions to help reduce food wastage – a cause that strongly resonates with her. She is keen to join our warehousing and bundle packing sessions soon to continue to support our mission in every way possible.

COLLEEN TAN

Colleen has been associated with FBSG since 2017. She volunteers at the warehouse (food packaging and distribution), and with FBSG events. Even the Covid-19 lockdowns didn't impede her commitment. She drove with her husband to deliver meals to a family service centre for vulnerable recipients.

"I choose to volunteer at FBSG as they're very well organised. They serve as a central clearinghouse for NGOs and their clients. 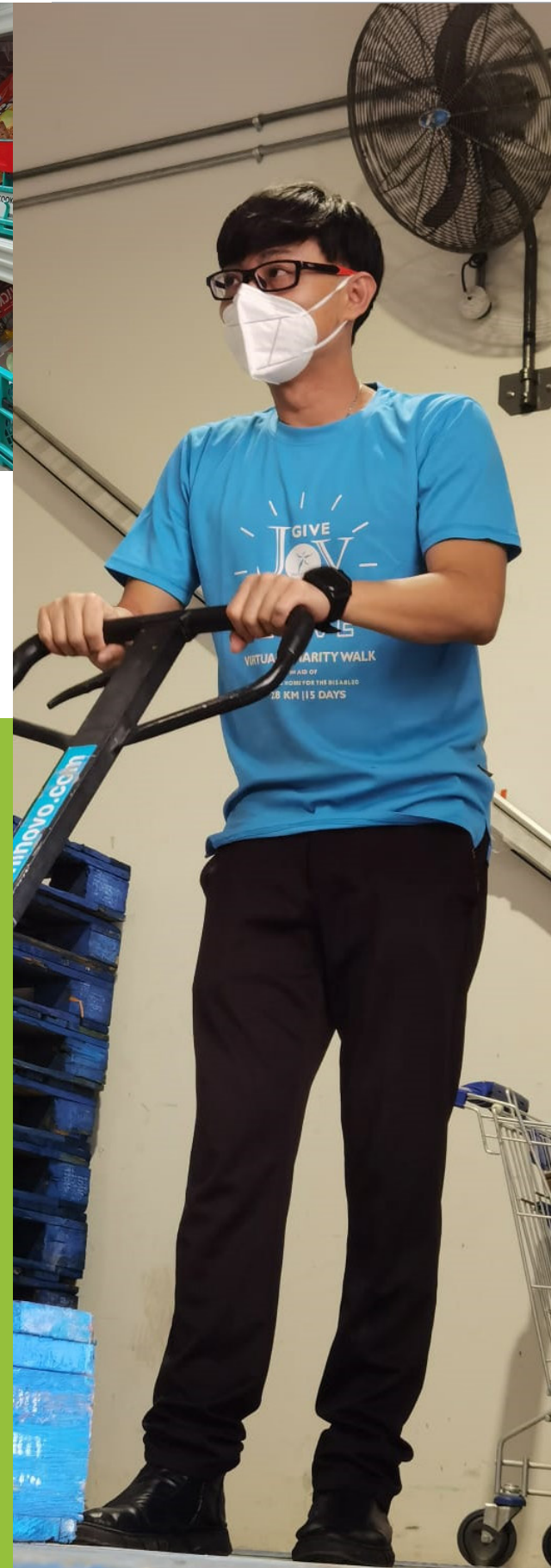


ROSENDO LARA LEON
